To clarify our response, the byelaws do not cover the entirety of QEOP estate. The byelaws cover those areas of the QEOP estate that have been set aside for the purpose of park and open spaces as defined in Part 1 (page 5) of the byelaws on the website, which clearly states the definitions for "the ground" and "designated area". These byelaw notices are only to be found in the Park and not Chobham Manor estate.

As such there is no explicit provision, for practical purposes, the Legacy Corporation consider the area of the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park estate that is covered by these byelaws to be the area defined by the Park railings and supported by the presence of notices in conspicuous places as this is specifically the area that is set aside for the purpose of park and open spaces.

Thank you for your response to my FOI request in which you referred me to a copy of the Byelaws on the London Legacy QEOP website and stated

"The Byelaws apply to designated areas of QEOP grounds which are set aside as park and open spaces. The physical Park boundary is defined by Park railings, as such it excludes Chobham Manor which is a separate residential estate and not defined for the purpose of these byelaws as pleasure grounds, public walks and open spaces."

I have downloaded a copy of the Byelaws from the website to which you referred me, but I can't find anything in them that defines the Park in the way you suggested. Can you please point me to the relevant provision in the Byelaws.
